"I don't lie or cheat. Don't be scared to tell the truth because we value honesty. Honesty is a good thing, even if you feel like you've made a mistake."

"It's good if you're described as respectful. You listen and take turns, you are polite and use good manners at all times."

"I am always honest with other people but sometimes you have to be careful that you don't hurt someone's feelings. You can be honest and kind."

"Even if someone is disrespectful, you can choose to be respectful back. You can show them how it looks. Be a good role-model to other people"

"I always do my homework and home reading. I get on with my learning and ask for help if I need it. I try to help myself too and be independent."

"It feels like hard work if it's a challenge but you can do it! Easy can feel boring. We sign up for clubs too which is fun and hard work."
