Reminders for Everyone!

Arriving at School:

One Way System - adults, if you are coming on site, please move around school using the one-way system.

Why? Because this ensures pupils get to their classes quickly and safely; it helps us be respectful to everyone's needs and to know when we have secured the site at the start and end of the day.
