# Gates Open at: 8.50 AM Prompt School Starts / Children in Class at: 8.55 AM Arrival at 9.00 AM = TOO LATE! School Ends at: 3.15 PM Prompt

A lot of children are coming into school late and after the school gates have closed. It is important for children to be punctual and to come to school on time. Lateness causes disruption in the office and in the classroom, it causes disruption for the teacher and the other children, and your child misses some vital learning.

Some of the reasons given - waking up late/alarm did not go off; too much traffic etc. - are not acceptable. It is your responsibility as a parent to ensure your child is in school on time.

Lateness also has an impact your child's attendance marks. The register is taken twice a day, which is two sessions a day, and lates after the register has closed are recognised as absent.

We hope to see an improvement in punctuality in the coming weeks.



You will have heard in the news that one of the teachers' unions has planned 4 strike days.

Mrs Fraser has some important information for you:

- 'Strike' means that teachers withdraw their labour and do not get paid
- This strike is because teachers' pay has not kept up with cost of living for over 10 years
- Teachers are also worried that pay increases will not be funded fully from the Government
- The school will stay open on these days
- Pupils must attend school as normal\*
- The school leadership supports the teachers' right to strike
- If any of our teachers who are members of the NEU choose to strike, their class will be supervised by other staff but may not get their usual lessons that day
- \* In extreme circumstances (e.g. illness of support staff), the school may have to close a class, and home learning activities will be provided.

Every morning that week, the school gate will open at 8.30am for parents / carers and pupils to come to the school hall where someone will tell a story before school.
