- Explore materials freely and ideas of how to use them

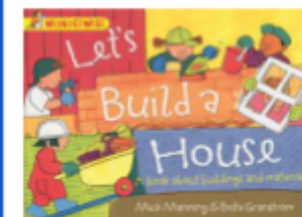
