Road Safety - especially in the bad weather - not many of us use cars but...

Mrs Fraser has been deeply concerned that some parents have continued to put their children at such risk by dropping off for school on the pavements between Cycle King and the bus stop. We have two very clear signs asking you not to do this, but in fact, the Highway Code makes even clearer it is illegal to do so on the double yellow lines and hatched area. This law is in place for the protection of your children - we have witnessed some very, very dangerous situations in the bad weather.

We must be the luckiest school in the Borough to have a public car park directly opposite us, and as we have assured you, there will be no charge or fine for the period of time it takes to cross the road safely and walk around the school's one-way route. When crossing the road, please use the designated place where a safety barrier protects you on the car park side and on the central crossing.

If we continue to witness the dangerous situations like this, we will have to request the support of enforcement officers, simply to keep your children safe... please understand the seriousness of the situation, thank you.
