# Attendance

Attendance this Term (up to 8th Dec) - School Average 94% We have had very good attendance from many pupils this term, and every week, I enter about 130 pupils on a 'Spin the Wheel' chance to win a prize for having 100% attendance in the previous week. Its lots of fun on Monday morning to celebrate these triumphs!

Sadly we still have about 40 of our pupils who are considered Persistent Absentees by the local and national authorities. This happens when your child misses 10% or more of school time (i.e. the equivalent of 1 day absent per fortnight). We write to let you know when your child is in the danger zone. Please ensure your child attends school - even when they are tired, grumpy or 'under the weather'.

You will see how much we encourage pupils with great awards and prizes from Mrs Roberts - please remind them of this to help you get them out of the door - but the greatest prize of all is that they will keep up with their learning, their friendships and become the best student that they can be.

## Lateness

Some children are still coming late to school, this is unacceptable. It is very disruptive to the office staff as they have to leave other important tasks to attend to your child and update registers and lunch orders; it is disruptive to the teachers who have to stop teaching to deal with your child; it is unfair to other parents and children who get to school on time, and then whose learning is disrupted because of the lateness of your child. Parents, you have a responsibility to get your children to school on time so that their learning is not impacted.
