

Celebrating 100% Attendance

Every week we recognise and reward the class which attained the highest percentage of attendance the week before. The names of the children who attended school every day the previous week are put in a draw and they all have the chance to win a small prize.

Every half term the children who have attained 100% attendance that term, receive an attendance certificate. If they attend 100% the two half terms that make up a term, they also receive a wristband inscribed with a praise (YOU ARE A STAR; YOU ARE AMAZING OR YOU ARE A LEGEND) – this is a 'badge' of honour and meant to be worn with pride. Each of the children are presented their certificates and wristbands and honoured at an assembly before the whole school. At the end of each academic year, children who have attained 100% attendance for the whole year are also honoured before the whole school

Last term we had 'The Twelve Days of Christmas Attendance', whereby every child who achieved 100% attendance the last twelve days of term were eligible to be entered into a draw to win a hamper of goodies – one child from KS1 and one child from KS2. There were also several other prizes with the opportunity for one child from each class to choose a prize. It is encouraging to see the number of pupils who make it in to school every day, and to them we say WELL DONE!
