Dear Parents and Carers,

Our Value for this half term is Honesty. This is also one of our key values for the whole school ethos, and I was delighted that the pupils can already explain what we mean by 'Honesty'. For example, they know that it is more than just telling the truth, it also means telling the whole truth. The children also knew that if they are not honest with their friends, they will not be trusted. The story of The Boy Who Cried Wolf is a really good way to talk about this: https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=IdNVeLoHWJA

We also need to be honest with ourselves - recognising your feelings even when they are difficult feelings to express. For us as adults, modelling honesty is supremely important. Children pick up our behaviours, as well as our words.

For older pupils we will be exploring again 'Is the Internet Honest?' In this day and age it is very hard to know what information we can trust on the internet - we teach children to think carefully about the source of the information - if it is trying to shock, upset or outrage you, it is probably just after clicks and not being honest with you.

Finally we remind children that they must be honest themselves on the internet. Adults - you can support this value by checking the age restrictions on the apps and games you give to your children. If you want any support with keeping your child safe online, please just ask your teacher, message us on Seesaw or ask at the School Office. Announcing our new School Houses!

Pupils took part in a big vote to decide on the names of our houses, all named after famous Bedford residents and many parents also had a vote if they attended a Parent Consultation last term. Thank you to everyone who participated.

The results are in!

Howard House - named after John Howard who lived in the 1700s - he was High Sheriff of Bedfordshire and improved conditions in England's prisons, starting with Bedford Prison

Thomson House - named after Pearl Thomson 1917 - 2014 - originally from Jamaica, she was a school teacher in Bedford (at Queens Park and Westfield) and a founding member of the Miracle Church, which provides our breakfasts at Priory Primary School

Clough House - named after Joe Clough 1887 - 1977 - Bedford's first black bus driver, chauffeur and taxi driver - in the First World War he joined the Army Service Corps at Kempston Barracks and drove a field ambulance at the Western Front.

Radcliffe House - named after Paula Radcliffe b. 1973 - a Bedford teenager who had asthma throughout her childhood, but joined the Bedford & County Athletic Club and went on to be three-time winner of the London Marathon and world champion long distance runner.

We will use our Houses to develop a friendly and respectful competitive spirit between our pupils. Look out for a note home to tell you which House your child belongs to, and which colour is connected with that House, as we will be asking pupils to wear the special colour t-shirt on Sports Morning - Monday 17th June 2024.

Cyber Choices and Online Safety Events

For parents / carers of children aged 9 and up

You are invited to attend two free online sessions to discuss all things "cyber".

These sessions will be suitable for parents/carers of children in Year 5 (age 9) and above. This will be a fantastic opportunity to learn and ask questions regarding your child's online world and it shouldn't be missed!

<u>Part 1</u> will introduce you to the Cyber Choices programme which will be delivered by the Eastern Region Cyber Choices Team. They will provide:

- An overview to parents and carers on what cybercrime is.
- What the risks to young people are.
- How the Cyber Choices programme supports at-risk individuals.
- How you can refer a young person into Cyber Choices.

You will also hear from Kent County Council's Education Safeguarding Team, who will provide an overview of;

- Some of the potential risks that children and young people may experience online.
- Advice to support parents to make informed decisions and keep their children safer online.
