

Key Vocabulary

United Kingdom – a country belonging to the European continent that includes four separate countries.

Atlas – a collection of maps, usually in book form.

Human feature – something that has been built by people.

Physical feature – something that has been formed by nature.

Coast – the area where the sea and the land meet.

Promenade – the road by the sea where people walk.

Cliff – a vertical or very steep natural wall of rock.

Bay – a body of water partially surrounded by land.

Seasons – four parts of the year known as spring, summer, autumn and winter.

Thermometer – an instrument for measuring or showing the temperature of something.

Pitch – how high or low a sound is.

Key Facts

-The United Kingdom is made up of four countries. These are England, Scotland, Wales and Northern Ireland.

-The capital cities of the countries in the UK are London, Edinburgh, Cardiff and Belfast.

Geography

-Name capital cities of the UK.

-Recognise human and physical features from a photograph (including the coast).

We will learn about the cycle of seasons and the changes we see and feel within those. We will undertake some experiments to measure factors such as temperature and rainfall.

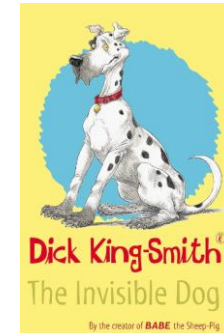
English
