Key Facts

Amphibians – A cold blooded vertebrate including frogs, toads and newts.

Animals – A living organism that feeds on organic matter.

Digestion – The process of digesting food.

Fish – A limbless cold-blooded vertebrate.

Food chain – A series of animals or plants dependent as a food source.

Invertebrates – An animal that does not have a backbone.

Mammals – A warm blooded animals that has a back bone.

Nutrients - A substance that provided by food that helps life and growth.

Photosynthesis – The process in how plants create food.

Plant – A living organism such as a tree, shrub or flower.

Reptiles – A vertebrate animal that is cold blooded, usually with scaly skin.

Root – Part of the plant that which anchors it to the ground.

Stem – The main body of the plant.

Vertebrates – Animals that have back bones.

Science

During this unit the children will look at the different functions of a flowering plant or tree.

The will explore the requirements of plant for life and growth and discover how these vary between the different plants.

The children will also explore how water is transported throughout a plant and how plants pollinate and reproduce. Finally they will explore different versions of seed dispersal and how these are different depending on the plants.

Geography

In this unit, the children will look at different countries around the world and recognise key physical and man-made features using topographical maps. They will also compare and contrast different countries and their features, looking at climates and habitats where animals live.
