

Maths

Numbers to 1000

Pupils will look at numbers up to 1000 and focus on the value of each digit: **place value**.

Pupils will learn how to compose and decompose numbers, compare, order and look for patterns.

Addition and subtraction

Pupils will start off with simple addition before moving on to addition where renaming is required. Subtraction is also covered in a similar way where simple subtraction is mastered before moving to subtraction where renaming is required.

Once pupils master addition and subtraction, they start to look at problem solving questions and practice using bar models.

Autumn Term 1 Year 3

PE

Tag Rugby: The children will take part in this invasion game and will develop their understanding of attacking and defending. During their games, they will learn to develop their skills and understanding of moving the ball towards the try line to score. The children will work on the fundamental values of rugby, including honesty in their play by managing the rules of small sided games themselves.

Fundamentals movements: Pupils will develop the fundamental skills of balancing, running, jumping, hopping and skipping. Pupils will develop their ability to change direction with balance and control. They will be given the opportunity to explore how the body moves at different speeds as well as how to accelerate and decelerate.

PSHE

Myself and my relationships pupils learn:

To contribute to discussions about how to make the classroom a place where they can learn safely.

To recognise emotions involved in being in a new situation and learn coping strategies.

To know how to make new people feel welcome in the class and school.

To know what strategies might be helpful if they are in a new situation.

Music

Instruments, composers, and the orchestra In this block of music lessons, the children will learn about the different sections of the orchestra and how they combine to create a piece of music. They will compose song accompaniments on untuned percussion instruments using their knowledge of rhythms and note values.

Computing

Online Safety

Pupils learn how to stay safe on whilst using the internet. They will learn to make strong passwords and that they should never share their passwords with others. They will understand how to communicate online whilst remaining safe. They will learn to discuss the appropriateness of websites and how to use the internet safely.

Religious Education

Where, how and why people worship?

The children will identify and describe key actions, features and artefacts help people worship in different religions. They will explore the meaning and value of worship, for themselves and others.

MFL

To answer simple phrases and responses pupils learn:

To say and respond to **guten tag**, **hallow** and **auf wiedersehen**. To understand the phrase **Wie heisst du?** (What is your name?)

To recognise German as being a different language.
