Dear Parents and Carers,

Last week, the KS2 Useful & Kind School Councillors delivered your generous harvest donations to the **Bedford Foodbank**. They were given a tour of the warehouse and discovered how the volunteers support families with food and the 'baby bank' for those times when things get really tough. Please remember that anyone can have difficult times - Priory Primary School can issue vouchers for families, so just have a quiet word with Miss Wilde or Mrs Fraser on the school gate if we can help.

Universal Breakfast Club - we run a free breakfast provision for 30 minutes before school registration.

- Pupils who would like a healthy breakfast should arrive at 8.15 am to be sure of enough time to eat!
- ALL PUPILS from Y1 to Y6 are welcome even if they have already had breakfast, and will be supervised by school staff, so adults can drop them at the school gate - no need to walk the one-way system anymore!
- HOWEVER, Nursery and Reception pupils are welcome to come to breakfast but they should still be taken to their classrooms at 8.35 am by a parent or carer, please.

The start of school is still 8.40 am, so can I please remind parents that they must arrive before 8.40 am leave the school site by 8.40 am.

We start our supervised Morning Walking for Y1 to Y6 at 8.35am. I'm delighted with how the children enjoy this start to the school day and how beautifully they look after each other, extending their friendships across the year groups.

Mobile Phones

A reminder for parents and <u>important information for new parents</u>. When you are on the school site we have a strict **NO MOBILE PHONES** policy as part of our Child Protection measures. We must have a completely fair, equal and simple rule for all. **Parents' and Carers' mobile phones must be kept in a pocket or bag if you cannot leave them at home**.

There is also a very positive benefit to this rule - it means that you can give full attention to your child when you drop off and pick them up from school. Your smiling face, and your listening attention is valuable and precious to them!

Don't be late through the gate! Be on time for school every day.


School starts: 8.40 AM
