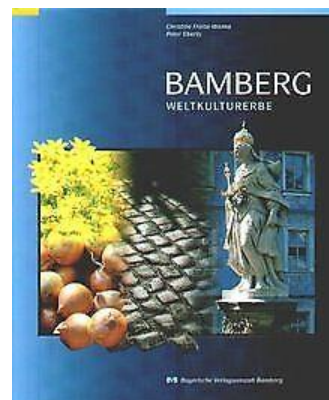
History
